Dear Friends



The sound of silence

Some people love silence – and others really don't! For some, silence is comfortable but for others every silence is an awkward silence.

Many years ago there was a move in the Church of England to include more silence in services. We tried it where I was (only 10 or 20 seconds at a time) and it really didn't work. People had said that the children (and their parents) would struggle with it, but they were fine. It was the adults who couldn't cope at all!

Within 5 seconds people were flicking through hymn books, rustling service orders and one man even started jangling his pocket change! People didn't like silence - except for 2 minutes at 11am on the 2nd Sunday of November. For those 2 minutes, no-one made a sound.

Silence is powerful because it reminds us that we do not have all the answers and that words and music do not say all that needs to be heard. At almost every funeral that I take, I include a time of silence and nearly always those few moments "work". At a time of national sadness, we are all encouraged to silence. When "I don't know what to say", it is good to say nothing.

Hidden away in the Old Testament is the Book of Job. It's a deeply mysterious book tackling the ever-present theme of undeserved suffering. Job is good and righteous, but a series of awful tragedies leave him desolate and suicidal. His three great friends go to him, and we are told "They sat on the ground with him for 7 days and 7 nights. No-one said a word to him, because they saw how great his suffering was". (Job 2:13) Their silence was the best thing the friends had to offer. When they opened their mouths to start "helping" Job, things went steadily downhill!

As we begin November, the shops are already into Christmas; but before we rush headlong into the festive season, we are once more called into times of silence. Many churches take the opportunity to remember "those we love but see no longer". And then on 11th and 13th we shall keep silence as a nation to remember with thanksgiving those who have died for their country in war.

Let's not treat these as awkward silences. Psalm 62:1 says, "For God alone my soul in silence waits". I wonder what He might say to you if only we will take time to wait on Him.

Parish Council update for Parish Magazine



September and October have been unusual months for the Parish Council. Following the resignation of our previous Clerk and our Administrative Officer, there has been recruitment to establish a locum Clerk to cover until a permanent post is established and a new Administrative Assistant has been appointed. The locum Clerk can be contacted by email only on clerk@downtonparishcouncil.gov.uk and, until the new posts are settled in, the contact telephone numbers for the Council are 01725 510505 to speak to the Chair of the Council (Jane Brentor) or 01725 511055 to speak to the Vice Chair of the Council (Dave Mace).

At the September meeting, County Councillor Richard Clewer provided an update on the following: additional spending has been allocated towards Parish Stewards; Wiltshire Council is handling all elements of government schemes in relation to the cost of living initiatives, with Wellbeing hubs being restarted, Warm Spaces initiative being coordinated, Business getting help from the Government on energy prices cap, Universal Credits and help with pensions, and identifying gaps with foodbanks and the volume of food being received currently not being enough.

Although the focus over this period for the Parish Council has been on recruitment and managing the impact of change following a long period of stability with a Clerk who was with us for 17 years, normal business has continued with the Council commenting on planning applications, managing repairs and liaising with Wiltshire Council.

The Council took the lead in the respectful acknowledgement of the late Queen's death and the proper ceremonies and processes.

An important part of the Council's work over these weeks has been the preparation of the budget for next year and the publishing of the financial audit report for the previous year.

News for the coming month includes the closing of part of the Borough between 10.00 and 12.00 for the Remembrance activities on the 14th November, the closing of part of the Borough on one side of the Greens at the end of October for resurfacing and progressing the implementation of the Speed Indicator Device.



Redlynch and District W I

The October meeting was very successful; we a had talk entitled 'A landscape shaped by the ancient tradition of the Commoner 'by Suzanne Kempe. She has only lived in the New Forest for twenty years, so is a relative new comer, but as a commoner she can let her ponies roam free in the forest for most of the year. She explained that you should never feed the animals as they need to steadily graze, anything more can cause colic or choking. Their natural grazing is also what maintains the New Forest.

The Verderers and Agisters regularly check the animals to make sure they are in good condition. In addition to ponies there are also cattle, donkeys and pigs; they are all owned by residents who care for their animals 365 days a year, usually alongside a normal lifestyle. The pigs are let out in the Autumn to eat the acorns, as they are harmful to the ponies. When driving in the forest always give the animals a wide berth especially at night; lowering your speed is an easy way to stay safe and make sure you stop in time.

#SaveSafely this winter

With living costs rising all the time, everyone is looking for ways to save some money, so Dorset & Wiltshire Fire and Rescue Service is highlighting some areas where a saving could be a false economy – and a fire risk.

The Service is asking people to #SaveSafely, and there is a wealth of information about staying safe at home and on the roads at www.dwfire.org.uk/save-safely. This includes energy saving tips, cooking safely advice, how to stay warm safely, staying safe when cutting costs, cutting the costs of driving, and signposting to financial help.

Some top tips include:

- Pulling something like electric heaters or electric blankets out of the loft, that haven't been used for years, can be risky. Watch for signs of dangerous or loose wiring, such as scorch marks, hot plugs and sockets, fuses that often blow, or circuit breakers that trip for no obvious reasons.
- If you're drying clothes indoors rather than use a tumble dryer, keep them well away from the heat source so they can't catch fire.
- Air fryers and microwave ovens are great at saving energy when cooking, but please read the manufacturer's instructions and keep them clean between uses.
- Getting chimneys swept when you have a woodburner or open fire is essential to reduce the risk of chimney fires. Also be careful of what you burn; green (unseasoned) wood may seem cheap, but it doesn't create much heat and it creates a residue that can easily catch alight within the chimney.
- Get your boiler serviced a well maintained boiler is more efficient and reduces the dangers of carbon monoxide poisoning.
- Only use the correct charger for mobile devices. Although it can be cheaper to buy imported and unofficial chargers, fake ones are often made with poor quality components that fail to meet UK safety regulations. This means they can cause injury, electric shocks and even fires.
- Make sure you follow the manufacturer's instructions when using wheat bags don't heat them for too long, or at too high a temperature.

Redlynch and District Local History Society

Following the AGM our October talk, based on Fordingbridge Workhouse, was given by Wendy Cracknell, a member of Fordingbridge Historical Society. During the past few years a group of members have been researching the history of the workhouse and its people and have produced a book 'A Place of Last Resort: the History of Fordingbridge Workhouse' which is due to be published this month.

Under the 1601 Poor Relief Act each parish became responsible for administering and organising relief of the poor living within the parish. Workhouses became a centre of care for the poor and in the latter part of the 17th century a group of cottages in Shaftesbury Street comprised the workhouse for the people of Fordingbridge. Under the 1834 Poor Law Amendment Act this became accessible not only to the residents of Fordingbridge, but also to those living in nine neighbouring parishes.

By 1881 the buildings were considered unsuitable for human habitation and a site for a new Workhouse was purchased in the Bartons. State of the art plans for the new building included rooms for couples, a separate children's block, a laundry, a kitchen and flushing drains - a sophisticated system for the 1880s. The new building opened in 1887 and Census records over the ensuing years show interesting demographic changes in the backgrounds and ages of the occupants.

In 1948 the buildings were taken over by the NHS and adapted for use as Fordingbridge Infirmary. In an area which now also includes the Doctor's Surgery, the Arch Clinic and Fordingbridge Dental Practice the site remains a place for the health and well being of the people of Fordingbridge and the surrounding district.




