Easter can be about chocolate!

Easter and chocolate eggs are synonymous with each other. Chocolate is the perfect end to a 'sweet free' Lent and eggs represent the new life Jesus experienced after death. However, for some, chocolate eggs simply mean it's Easter time with the addition of baskets, bonnets, bunnies and cute lambs! One of my childhood memories is decorating a yellow plastic waste paper bin with scrunched up tissue paper and adding a ribbon, before turning it upside down to make the perfect Easter bonnet...or not!

I'm sure there are many reasons why the resurrection of Jesus doesn't appear in many of our Easter celebrations but I suspect one may be disbelief. Well, disbelief is nothing new. You may have thought that Jesus' friends wanted so much to believe that he'd risen from the dead that they didn't ask questions but they did and surely his enemies would have loved to have found and produced his dead body but they didn't. So, our questions and doubts are nothing new. How can Jesus be alive? Belief in the truth can sometimes be hard but after their initial confusion and disbelief Jesus' disciples and many followers since have believed that the guarded tomb was empty and Jesus was and is alive. Below is a short retelling of that first Easter morning.

Christ is Risen.
He is alive!
Or maybe you've got it wrong?
Christ is Risen. He is Risen indeed.
Or maybe they just moved his body away?
Listen, we've seen him and heard his voice.
Are you sure it was really him?
This is the truth, Jesus is alive.

Application forms must be returned and amendments notified by <u>Sunday</u>, <u>2nd April 2023</u>. The new Electoral Roll will be presented at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on Sunday, 23 April, when those whose names are listed will be eligible to vote.

Being on the Church Electoral Roll is a way of saying that you are a member of a church. To be eligible you should be baptised and aged 16 or over, a member of the Church of England (or a Church in communion with the Church of England) and resident in the Parish. If you are not resident in the Parish you will need to have attended the church regularly for six months prior to enrolment.

11 Parish Council update March 2023



Members of the public attending the Parish Council meeting expressed concern about the state of the Borough Greens following works by SSE. This was followed up by the Council and SSE having agreed to rectify the area. Concern was also expressed about local rubbish bins not being emptied and this has also been followed up with the contractor.

PC Jung gave an update about crime and follow up actions in the Parish, saying that there has been a spate of thefts and shop lifting as well as sheds broken into. He stated that, due to his upcoming retirement, PC Harry Murphy will be attending Parish Council meetings in the future.

Downton's revised Neighbourhood Plan draft has now been submitted to Wiltshire Council for views and comments. We await comments from the Neighbourhood Planning team to know whether more work is required in order to make our plan fit for the future.

A meeting was held on 7th March with presentations from Wessex Water, the Environment Agency and the Drainage team from Wiltshire Council. The meeting was attended by approximately 60 residents who were able to learn the complications of different responsibilities between the agencies and the work that is being undertaken to combat future flooding.

An Amenities committee meeting was held on 27th February with the main purpose of moving forward the project to refurbish the local play parks. The outlines for the project were agreed and the Council will now approach interested providers of equipment and it is hoped that work will begin in the late Summer.

Following successful interviews, a new Parish Administrative Officer has been appointed who will begin her contract on 11th April.

Subject to full documentation, the Parish Council granted permission for the use of the Memorial Gardens on 8th May for a celebration of the King's coronation. This will include bands, dancing and a show.

It was agreed that an apple tree will be planted in memory of the late Queen Elizabeth II and the Parish Council agreed on wording for a plaque. The tree planting will take place at midday on 16th April on the Beacon Green – all welcome

Redlynch Local History Society

This month James Holden came to give a talk entitled 'Nonconformist Chapels in Wiltshire'. James is an architectural historian whose recently published book documents chapels within Wiltshire.

James' talk, illustrated with photos to show the variety of chapels built, traced 300 years of Nonconformist chapel design from the Cromwellian, Charles II and William & Mary periods, finishing with a closer look at chapels in the Redlynch area.

James spoke about the range of chapels, from small rural meeting houses to large town churches for congregations of 1500 people. One of the oldest and smallest was Monks Lane Chapel in Corsham, dating from 1662, built in a cottage style. One of the largest was Zion Hill Chapel in Tisbury, a substantial stone building opened in 1842.

After the Restoration in 1660 Nonconformists were more persecuted and services more disrupted. It became dangerous for Nonconformists such as Baptists, Methodists, Quakers and Puritans, to practise. In order for chapels to be inconspicuous they were then built in a simple style with interiors arranged in a symmetrical layout with galleried seating for the poorer members of the congregation and boxed pews on the ground floor for those able to afford to rent them.

Nonconformist Chapels in Redlynch included:

- Chapel Cottage in Chapel Lane, which closed in 1975 and was converted to a house in the 1980s
- Hamptworth Wesleyan Methodist Chapel, built in 1876, with school rooms, which closed in the 1970s and has been converted to a house
- Nomansland Primitive Methodist Chapel, built in 1901 and still in use
- Redlynch Ebenezer Primitive Methodist Chapel, Morgan's Vale Road, dating from 1877 and now in residential use.

Our next talk is "The New Forest Verderers Court" by artist, conservationist and ex-verderer Peter Frost at Morgans Vale & Woodfalls Hall at 7.30 pm on Tuesday 4th April.




