#### Dear Friends.

The Coronation of His Majesty King Charles III last month, was an extraordinary experience. I wonder what your highlights were. For me (apart from the fashion, and the soldiers' drill) it was the anointing of the King behind those screens – held together by the soldiers demurely looking away. For during the anointing King Charles was set-apart for a distinctive calling – his vocation to be our King and supreme governor of the Church of England.

It was the moment when Charles accepted his sovereignty under God's; when he acknowledged the heavy burden placed upon him to represent and speak for the people of this country and commonwealth, and to lead us. The anointing of kings goes back millennia. As we read in the Old Testament of Samuel anointing Saul as Israel's first king and then David as his successor, or of Zadok the priest and Nathan the prophet anointing Solomon, oil was seen as a way of sealing-in God's Spirit into his chosen servants. It was a lavish extravagance by which the recipient would 'glow' which was reserved for monarchs and the special role they were called to perform.

Over time, but particularly during the Christian era, anointing came to be a symbol of God's working in and for all his people. The Church has adopted anointing for the many during services of baptism, confirmation, and ordination, when the candidates – to varying degrees – offer themselves to God's service. It is used during prayers for those who are sick or dying as a symbol of the healing, consolation, and renewed hope we have in Christ; that in him we may find peace and comfort and share in the fullness of his risen life. No longer is it the sole preserve of the monarch.

All of us, through our baptism and confirmation, have like King Charles been set apart for particular tasks and ministries within the Church and our wider society. Some of these will be complicated and demand a lot from us – perhaps even a lifetime, others are more simple and general – but equally as important. It is heartening that The King asked the Nation to get involved in volunteering on the Coronation Bank Holiday. He is encouraging all of us to respond to the needs we see in our community and concerning our environment. He is asking us to show love for one another. He is asking us to care for our planet. He is asking us to respond to the call God places on our lives and to serve.

Many of us already serve our communities in many and wonderful ways, but the question still remains, what more can I do? What else could I do? What gifts can I use better in serving others? How can I respond to being set apart as one of God's chosen ones? These are questions we all need to answer. For some it may be to spend more time in prayer. For others it might be writing to our politicians and lobbying them on behalf of others. Perhaps it might be appropriate to volunteer for a charity, club, or society that helps the young or vulnerable, or even to take on more responsibility within the life of the Church. May God bless us all in our service, and may God bless our King.




Well done and thank you again, whatever part you played!

The Parish Council's annual meeting took place on 15<sup>th</sup> May at which it was confirmed that Jane Brentor will remain as Chair and Dave Mace as Vice Chair. The Parish Council considered some of its policies and governance statements in order to re-adopt these for the coming year and also to decide who will form each of the Council's committees and who will represent the Council at meetings of outside bodies. In general, these remained unchanged and information is on the Council's website.

Confirmation has been received of the loan of £180,000 now available for refurbishing the playgrounds. It is very much hoped that the Council will be able to source providers to carry out the playground refurbishment by means of a tendering exercise and that this work can begin before the coming winter. News was also received of a grant of £5,000 from Wiltshire Council's Town's programme to promote local retail outlets.

### 13 News from Downton Band

Downton Band have been playing at the Annual Cuckoo Fair for as long as anyone can remember. This year's performances over the Cuckoo Fair weekend - throughout the day on the Saturday, and for their annual concert at the Memorial Hall on the Sunday - took on an added poignancy and significance as the Band celebrate their 150th Anniversary.

All three Downton Bands - Beginners Brass, the Downton Training Band and the senior Downton Band - played throughout the day on Saturday, offering enthusiastic crowds a rousing mix of traditional and modern brass music. The theme running through the performances this year was "Circuses, Celebrations and Festivities", a theme that saw the Memorial Hall packed to the rafters on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> April as the three Bands performed a wide repertoire of celebratory music. This special programme of uplifting brass music was echoed as the Senior Band played again as part of the village's Coronation Celebrations on 8<sup>th</sup> May.

The Band's summer/autumn schedule is a particularly busy one in their Anniversary year. A joint concert is planned with close neighbours, the Woodfalls Band, at St Thomas' Church in Salisbury on Saturday 17<sup>th</sup> June, and a landmark 150th Anniversary Concert will be held in the village on 9<sup>th</sup> July.

In early June the Band will be making a pilgrimage to the Lancashire/Yorkshire Moors to take part in the annual "Whit Marches", often billed as "the greatest free show on earth"! More than 100 bands from all over the UK - and some from Europe - descend on towns and villages around Saddleworth to compete in as many individual moors village contests as possible in one summer's afternoon and evening.

The band are reaching out this year to ex-players, plus present and past associates to lend historic photographs, memorabilia and artefacts to display at some of their forthcoming concerts - or to borrow, copy and return. ## Our Summer Show will be held in the Memorial Hall at 2.00 pm on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> June.



We are also very grateful to Downton Primary School for allowing us to exhibit things made by the children out of recycled materials, as part of their Eco-schools initiative. There will also be refreshments, a sales table and a raffle, and prize giving at 4.15 pm.

### **Good Companions**

In March Steve Hera gave a very sad and vivid account of the sinking of the Titanic on 14<sup>th</sup> April 1912 when it hit an iceberg on its maiden voyage to America, resulting in a 9ft gash below the waterline. The seawater flooded into all the hold compartments, which only had 10ft high walls; as a consequence only 705 survivors were rescued by the Carpathia. 1,500 people lost their lives, and only 306 bodies were recovered. The Orchestra musicians remained on board playing music, one of which was "Nearer my God to thee".

In April we had a very welcome visit from Carol Watson. She and her husband had gone on holiday to the Bahamas, staying on one island for a few days before moving on to the next island, visiting three or four; each one giving a different experience. Carol's talk included her wonderful photographs of the beautiful flowers and shrubs they saw, and the different types of small dwellings they stayed in, close to small or larger sandy beaches. It was clear from her commentary that she had had a special and happy holiday experience.

### Alabaré's Boots on the Ground programme

Local charity Alabaré provides support and accommodation for people who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless across Wiltshire and the South West.

Alabaré's 'Boots on the Ground' programme is supporting both young people and veterans, providing mental health support by delivering a range of outdoor activities, and by providing volunteering opportunities on community projects. The team have recently taken a group of young people for a residential week in the New Forest where they joined in with activities such as outdoor cooking, animal tracking and team-building. Some of Alabaré's veterans are also involved with developing the Community Garden at Arundells in Salisbury. Those who are taking part in all these activities are finding it of huge benefit to their wellbeing, confidence and self-esteem. As resident Ryan says, "I don't usually go out much due to social anxiety but 'Boots on the Ground' allows me to meet new people in a comfortable environment. It helps me to interact with people and pursue my interests which will hopefully lead to employment soon."

Knowing the positive impact this work has on the mental health and wellbeing of their residents, Alabaré is keen to ensure that as many as possible are given the opportunity to join with a wide range of outdoor activities. 
