

Dear Friends

Our Greatest Need

I love the (probably) true story of a mother and child in a supermarket. In every aisle, the child would say, "Mummy, I want ..." The mother reminded her that "I want doesn't get" and all went quiet ... until they turned the corner into the next aisle. "Mummy, I NEED ..."

It isn't only children who struggle to recognise the difference between what we need and what we want. A Bishop tells the story of a conversation with two Churchwardens during a vacancy, "Well, he said, I have two possible candidates; one is just what you want – and the other is what you need."

One of the wonderful things about coming to God in prayer is that He knows exactly what we need, so we don't always get what we want. This can however, leave people disappointed with God and with prayer.

But God is used to human disappointment and nowhere is this more obvious than in the life and ministry of Jesus. At the beginning of February we remember in church the time when Jesus was presented in the Temple, 40 days after He was born. (Luke 2: 22-40). Even on that occasion, Simeon spoke of Him as one who would be rejected. Jesus wouldn't grow up to offer people what they wanted – but He was and is just what we need.

The author and Pastor Max Lucado writes this:

If our greatest need had been information, God would have sent an educator. If our greatest need had been technology, God would have sent us a scientist. If our greatest need had been money, God would have sent us an economist.

But since our greatest need was forgiveness, God sent us a Saviour.



Christmas Tree Festival: The Downton Christmas Tree Festival this year was a great success; we raised £2,200, half for the Salisbury Samaritans and half for the St Laurence repair fund. This success was down to all the many people who helped us: those who prepared and cleared up the church, who brought their trees and wreaths to exhibit, who baked cakes, who collected and contributed items for both our re-gifting stalls, those who manned the stalls and servery, and the musicians who kept us all entertained. We are very grateful to the Samaritans' volunteers who attended to chat about their work with visitors.

Many thanks for the contributions from the hundreds of you who came to enjoy the spectacle, music and refreshments, as well as those who attended the Choral evensong with the Farrant singers on the Friday evening. We look forward to another successful event in 2023



Crisis: We are grateful to all who supported our Christmas Charity – Crisis. I am delighted to report that we raised £111.

Salisbury Food Bank: Thank you to all who donated to the foodbank whether by donation at church or through a supermarket. I was able to deliver 28 kgs of food items to the foodbank before Christmas. This brings our grand total for the year to over 60 kgs.

Tuesday Pop-in: Our 'warm space' initiative during November and December was much appreciated by those who visited. They were grateful for a warm drink and biscuits and to be able to 'chat' with our ministry team.

Christingle: We were able to hold our Christingle Service this year following the enforced break because of Covid. The service was very successful with a full church of adults and children. We are very grateful to the Venerable Alan Jeans for all his work in ensuring the service could take place. £295 was collected for the Childrens' Society. It was a delight to see again the faces of children glowing in the light of the candles.

Parish Council update January 2023



Firstly a very Happy and Peaceful New Year to you all from Downton Parish Council

At this time of year flooding becomes more of a problem and we are actively monitoring the situation, whilst liaising with the Flood Wardens and the Environment Agency. We are also in contact with Wessex Water regarding the flooding in Wick Lane.

We are pleased to confirm that the broken panel in the bus shelter located at A338 Salisbury Rd (opposite The Bull PH) has now been repaired.

Preparations are starting for the Downton Cuckoo Fair 2023.

Training is being given to a small team of local residents to be able to put up and take down the Speed Indicator Device so that this can be fitted on the Borough to try to help manage traffic speeds. The Device is to be shared with Redlynch and it is hoped that this will come to Downton soon.

The Parish Council is meeting to set the budget which will inform the precept (or local element of the council tax). Unfortunately, just to carry on, means that our contracts for such things as grass cutting are subject to a higher level of inflation but we will try to keep the increase to a reasonable level whilst still providing services.

Sadly, due to personal reasons, Janie de Lang has tendered her resignation from the post of Admin Officer. We are therefore now actively seeking a replacement. As we come to the end of the season of Epiphany

We do not have a separate magazine for the month of January, unlike the other churches in our Team, so we miss the chance to read the 'Vicar's letter' for that month. This year, Archdeacon Alan Jeans, in his role as our Associate priest, shared some thoughts about the meaning of Epiphany – a long season in the church's year, which we tend to celebrate along with Christmas, but then put to one side.

The following extract from Alan's letter encourages us to think about the gifts brought by the wise men, and goes on to challenge us about what we offer to God.

We are all familiar with the last verse of 'In the bleak mid-winter.'

'What can I give him, poor as I am, If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb.

If I were a wise man, I would do my part, yet what I can I give him, give my heart.'

At the start of a new year, it is a good time to take another look at our response to God:

How well do we give ourselves to God in response to his wonderful gift to us?

How readily and regularly do we spent time with God in worship, in prayer, in reading his Word?

How readily and regularly do give of ourselves and our time to someone who needs love and compassion?

How do we care for the earth and work to ensure its sustainability? How readily do we give to God, not second best, but the best of what we have to offer?

The wise men went home by another road, we too can walk a different road this year, a road where we can make the king of kings the living, active centre of everything we are and do as individuals and as a church.

RSPB Big Garden Birdwatch

Just pick an hour over the weekend of **27**th – **29**th **January 2020** and record the birds and certain animal species you see in your garden. 



Reflections for Lent 2023 By Kate Bruce, Mark Oakley and Graham James, CHPublishing, £4.99

Reflections for Lent are designed to enhance your spiritual journey through the forty days from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday.

Covering Monday to Saturday each week, it offers reflections on readings from the Common Worship Lectionary, written by some of today's leading spiritual and theological writers.

Each day includes: full lectionary details for Morning Prayer; a reflection on one of the Bible readings; a Collect for the day.

This volume offers daily material for 22nd February to 8th April 2023. It is ideal for individuals and groups seeking Lectionary-based reflections for use during Lent and Holy Week, or for anyone wishing to try Reflections for Daily Prayer before committing to a year's worth of material. It also features a simple form of morning and night prayer, a guide to keeping a good Lent and an introduction to lectio divina by Stephen Cottrell.

Redlynch Local History Society

Peter Roberts and Georgina Babey stood in, at very short notice, for our indisposed scheduled speaker for our January talk. This talk was well received by an audience of 71.

John Pern Tinney (1779-1832) a solicitor, writer of political pamphlets, and Mayor of Salisbury (1805) planted the 60 acres site in the village to commemorate his marriage to a widow Charlotte May (neé Tayler) in 1822. The plantation was sold to the Newhouse Estate in 1849 who felled and replanted the site over more than a century including during the two World Wars.

Gerry Mundey, a retired diver who worked with the pioneer underwater conservationist Jacques Cousteau, purchased the woodland in 1980. He built a house within the wood for his personal use. He was a keen animal and plant lover; he hybridised plants, some of which bear his and Tinney's name and appear in the Royal Horticultural Society's listings. He gifted the wood to the Woodland Trust in 1989 on his death. Unusually he is buried within the wood with his cat in a private garden bearing the inscription 'In life and death they guard the wood'.

All in all a very successful evening due to the speakers and the efforts of various committee members to publicise the change of subject. The scheduled talk on Redlynch House will be held at a later date. Our talk for 7th February is "Life in a medieval village" by Mary Harris, at 7.30pm at Morgans Vale and Woodfalls Hall.






