

Downton Parish News is published 10 times a year, and is also currently online. Information for contributors and advertisers is at the back of the magazine, together with details of home delivery.



Dear Friends

Celebrating the "Ordinary"

"So", I said, "What are we going to say about Jim?"
The bereaved family looked worried and the son spoke up.
"Well, that's a bit of a problem. Dad was so – ordinary."



He had been a keen singer and although known as a man of few words, he had a reputation for his honesty and gentleness.

So, Jim had not been so "ordinary" after all and his funeral became a quiet celebration of a life well lived.

This year, Easter is very late and so Lent does not begin until 2nd March. This means that the whole of February is what the Church calls "Ordinary Time". Does that mean that nothing much is going on?

I grew up being told that "the only good thing about February is that it is short!" But I have grown in recent years to disagree – a month that begins in the depth of winter will end with the promise of spring. Whatever the British weather may throw at us, we may know for sure (because my diary says so) that by the end of the month, the sun will be rising at 6.48am and setting at 5.37pm. It's ordinary. It happens like this every year, but after another really difficult winter, even ordinary things can lift our spirits and point us to the love of God "new every morning".

Someone whose story teaches us to celebrate the Ordinary is Brother Lawrence, who lived in 17th century France. He was a lay brother (not a monk) and spent his days doing menial jobs in the monastery kitchen. But he grew to discover God in the ordinary things of his life and after his death, a book was written about his extraordinary life of faith.

"The Practice of the Presence of God" is still published and read widely today.

Welcoming The Very Reverend Stephen Lake, Dean of Gloucester

Many readers will have heard by now that The Very Reverend Stephen Lake, Dean of Gloucester, is to be appointed as the next Bishop of Salisbury, succeeding the Right Reverend Nicholas Holtam who retired last July.

Bishop Karen, who has responsibilty for Dorset within our diocese says: "I am delighted that Stephen has accepted the invitation to be the 79th Bishop of Salisbury. He brings significant creative gifts of leadership to the diocese at an important time in our life as we continue to encourage the local church to be the best that it can be, bringing hope to our local communities in sharing the love of Jesus Christ. Stephen knows the diocese from the past and understands the challenges and opportunities for both our urban and our rural contexts. Bishop Andrew and I are very much looking forward to working with Stephen and welcoming him and Carol into the diocese later in the year.

We anticipate that Stephen will be consecrated as Bishop sometime after Easter and will be enthroned in Salisbury Cathedral late in the summer"



Roads to God Prayer Group

The next Roads to God Prayer Group will meet on Wednesday 16th February 2022 at 10.30am in St. Laurence Church and will be led by Rev Ron Hart. We will pray for both the particular roads in our prayer cycle together with the whole village.



The Parish Council meetings were held at the Downton Memorial Centre on Monday 13th December 2021 and Monday 10th January 2022. Five members of the public were present at each meeting.

Unitary Cllr Richard Clewer:

- Cllr Clewer reported that the recent incidents involving the use of catapults had highlighted the need for a Public Space Protection Order for Downton and Redlynch and this was being worked on.
- The Police & Crime Commissioner was fully aware of the issues in Downton and there were to be a number of consultation events with the police outside the Co-op during January and February.
- The arrival of Omicron had led to staff being moved to support the public health team again and this would continue for a number of weeks.
- The Council had been advised of the money it was to receive from central government which was better than initially hoped but still insufficient to deliver all of the Council's priorities for 2022/23.

Amenities: Various works to repair bus shelters, replace damaged bins, installation of bollards and the delivery of the speed indicator device were reported by the Clerk.

Precept & Budget for 2022/23: A budget and precept of £135,518 was approved by the Council which was an increase of 18% on 2021/22 and a Band D figure of £96.87. The projects for the year ahead are a refurbishment of the play areas and public toilets, a traffic survey and further improvement works to Downton Cemetery.

Vacancies: There are currently 5 vacancies for councillors on the Parish Council. If you are interested in finding out more about becoming a councillor, please contact the Clerk.

The next meeting is on Monday 14th February 2022 at 7.30 pm at the Downton Memorial Centre, The Borough, Downton.

With Covid-19 restrictions still in place at the Memorial Centre only 21 people can be present at a meeting; any written questions for the Council can be sent to the Clerk by 12 noon on the day of the meeting.

Given the current infection levels and the Omicron variant of Covid, we understand that there will be concerns about holding the Cuckoo Fair in 2022.

As a part of our usual course of planning, we will be consulting with representatives of village-based and local organisations by the end of January to consider the options and their plans for operating in a Covid safe way, as well as listening to concerns. Given that the majority of the committee live in Downton and the surrounding villages, as do our family members and friends, we are very mindful of the possible impact of Covid on the residents of Downton and the local area.

We'd like to take this opportunity to reassure you that we also have direct contact with Wiltshire Council's Event Safety Advisory Group, and take account of Industry wide guidance on holding safe events. We have highly qualified and experienced health and safety people on the Cuckoo Fair team as well as people who are on the frontline of managing the impacts of Covid. So we hope you'll agree that we are very well placed to make an informed and measured decision about the Fair, based on the latest information. We'll endeavour to keep everyone informed of our decisions as the situation changes.

Can The Stockman & Woodlands Trust Help You?

Who are we?

The William Stockman Charity was founded in 1626 when William Stockman of Downton left his property, Shadwell Farm in Whiteparish, in trust, directing that the rent should be distributed amongst the poor with children. The John Woodlands Charity was founded in 1881 when he left monies in his will for the benefit of 'old men' and 'spinsters and widows'. Together these charities now form the Stockman and Woodlands Trust.

What do we do?

The purpose of the Trust is to help people living in the parishes of Downton and Redlynch who are in need, hardship or distress by paying for items, services or facilities.

Every year the Trustees, from the parishes of Downton and Redlynch, distribute the dividends of the charities to deserving causes with the emphasis on the young and old.

Examples of aid given recently

- Contribution towards the cost of a school residential trip.
- Help for a single parent towards the cost of buying school uniform.
- Music lessons for a child.
- Help with funding speech therapy for a child.
- Contribution towards travel costs for patients/relatives making frequent hospital visits.
- Plants distributed at Christmas to parishioners who are grieving the loss of someone during the year.

The Downton Society Moviola Returns for Spring 2022

Christmas is past and now a New Year beckons. Despite the presence of Covid and its associated variants, we all seem to be managing life here in Downton. Sensible precautions and appropriate vaccinations may well see 2022 being a turning point. So, with that in mind, Sue and I decided that we should still go ahead this Spring although being particularly mindful of the Government guidelines prevailing at the time of each performance. We are now looking at three Moviola performances for the Spring, starting in February.

Please note that there is one small change that has been placed upon us by Moviola in that they are no longer providing paper tickets so entry to the films will be on a first come, first served basis at the door of the Memorial Hall on the night. We will merely keep a tally of the number of people attending on the night for audit purposes. Redlynch Local History Society

Allowing for the uncertainties of the current situation Redlynch and District Historical Society had a talk in a different format. Georgina Babey and Peter Roberts based their talk – Secret Marriage - on research following their delving into the private archives held by the Andersons of the Hamptworth Estate. The life of George Morrison and his wife was shown in a video presentation.

Inheriting a fortune at age 21 he bought the 2,000 acre estate and proceeded to add more than another 1,000 acres before his early death in 1884 at the age of just 44.

Eight years earlier he had secretly married the divorced Jane Barbara Bastable in Dublin. Her early life was a tale of poverty, beatings by her first husband and a mystery child. A legal battle for the estate with George's family followed Morrison's death. She won and ran the estate successfully for the rest of her life ably supported by her daughter 'Miss Charlton'. They were a notable philanthropic couple and many of their bequests are still manifest e.g. Nomansland School.

Questions were then answered by the speakers.

Our next talk, which comes highly recommended, is on 1st February at 7.30pm in Woodfalls and Morgans Vale Hall. Our speaker will be Lesley Self, on 'The History of Salisbury District Hospitals'.

For the following month (1st March) we have Dr Gale Pettifer on 'The New Forest and its commoning, past, present, and future'.

Members of the Croquet Club have volunteered their time and their expertise to make this project happen and, as ever, the students will be relying on their parents for some aspects of transport. The project, however, is being delivered at no cost to the school or the students.

Club Chair, Steve Bennett, has stated that the Club will need to buy new junior mallets for some of the students, but otherwise, all of the full croquet kit will be used. The Club is going to give the students a first class introduction to the sport with a huge emphasis on enjoyment. The Club is really looking forward to this exciting new project.

The Croquet Association, the sport's governing body, believes that this is the first such link between a croquet club and a D of E group in the country. It added that it would be watching the project with interest, as would other croquet clubs in the UK.

As this project goes on, it might well lead to the formation of a Junior Section at the Croquet Club. Who knows, perhaps this section might be organised by a local young person involved with their Silver or Gold Award?


