Fancy a drink?



Many years ago, if I was talking about a spirit then I would have been referring to any number: brandy, vodka, gin, and even a bizarre one called green chartreuse (which I've just looked up and it is actually a liqueur!). However, these days if I'm talking about a spirit then it's *probably* more likely to be the Holy Spirit. How life has changed.

The pandemic brought many changes to our lives. Some welcome, others less so. For some, being able to work from home and spend more time with immediate family has been a welcome change, whereas the limitations on travel and going out have left others feeling isolated and alone. I heard today how online medical appointments have been more appropriate and accessible for some, whilst for others, an online appointment could never replace being able to see a medical professional face to face. Changes that suit some, don't always suit others.

As the restrictions are gradually lifting, we are recognising that some of the changes that the pandemic brought may remain and life may not return to how it was before. Different changes will be welcomed by different people. Others may wish for everything to return to 'normal'.

When Jesus knew that things were going to change for his disciples, he prayed. He asked God to protect them and God gave them a gift, the Holy Spirit. This gift was more than something to get them through a rough patch and it wasn't some kind of magic potion that would make everything seem okay or return things to how they were. What he was giving them was something that would enable them to change, even to be born again; he was offering them a new life with him. This may all sound odd, which is exactly what I thought too until I accepted his gift myself.

Now rather than filling my glass with a spirit at the end of a day, I ask God to fill my life at the beginning of every day. The Holy Spirit can transform our lives as he is life-giving and sets us free! When someone next asks, "would you like a drink?" remember the Holy Spirit and say yes to God's gift too! (And in case you're wondering, I still do enjoy a glass of brandy or gin now and then!)

There are service sheets on the website for all recorded Sunday and some other services which can be viewed or downloaded, enabling you to join in with prayers and responses. Within the Team, there are also online services available each week from St Mary Redlynch and St Andrew Landford.

Morning Worship continues to be said by the Vicar at 10.30am on Wednesdays in church. This is <u>not</u> a public or recorded service, but he will ring the church bell at 10.30am as a call to worship and you are encouraged to join him in a time of prayer from your own homes. On the third Wednesday of the month he will incorporate our Roads to God prayers (see page 5).

The Church is open for private prayer on Wednesdays, from 11:00am to 12:00pm. A member of the Church will be present at all times as a steward, and everyone will be asked to maintain physical distancing and to leave their contact details.

Put the date in your diaries and come along for a fun filled afternoon with your family! All funds raised will be split between the Primary School and Pre-School.


Entry is £1 on the gate and we will have a bouncy castle, fun stalls, live music, a cake sale, pimms and prosecco and much more to enjoy on the day!



Downton Mini Recycling Centre

The recycling shed is situated round the back of the Baptist Church in South Lane. And the good news is that we are now able to re-open in a limited way! The shed has had a clear out and refresh so that it is ready for some of your recycling again. Please leave items in the correct containers.



We are now collecting:

Pet food pouches (clean and dry);

Toothpaste tubes, toothbrushes;

Crisp packets; Plastic confectionery wrappers;

Low energy light bulbs and Water filter cartridges

Please be aware that at present we can collect only what we know we can move on safely. If there's no labelled container, then we are not currently collecting that item! Unfortunately, if something is left that we are not collecting it will be thrown away. As will batches of mixed recycling - we currently don't have the resources to sort out a mixture of items.

If you are leaving pet food packaging or crisp packets, please read the extra information on how to package them to help.

Please don't leave batteries - they are easy to recycle at the Co-op or the Pharmacy - or anywhere that sells them eg Robert Dyas in Salisbury.

Where else can you recycle?

Wiltshire Air Ambulance have a recycling centre in the Phoenix Emporium, Tollgate Road, Salisbury, which has now reopened. There you can recycle crisp packets, plastic sweet wrappers, baby food pouches, Pringles tubes...... We are hoping to increase our range in future, but do not have the capacity to do so at the moment.

There is still ample time to get involved in the village wide litter pick which runs from May 28th to June 13th. Help out by doing a clean-up in your local area, and recycling where possible.

Replace or repair?

The goal of living more sustainably involves making choices on many aspects of daily living. Amongst these is the question of whether we can give a longer life to what we buy, rather than opting for regular replacement. In the past the ready availability of repair services, along with the necessary component parts helped to ensure the longevity of essential household goods, but over time repair has become difficult, sometimes impossible. The 'culture of disposability' encourages buying new, with consequent waste and increased environmental pollution. This issue has come into even sharper focus with the massive worldwide consumption of electronic goods.

The recent Radio 4 series **Dare to Repair** (find on BBC Sounds) put the spotlight on the problems of pursuing repair over replacement, especially in relation to the mounting volume of electronic waste. According to the independent think tank Green Alliance, the UK produces massive quantities of this type of waste - amounting to an average of 24 kilos per person per year. Whilst some materials can be recovered through recycling, the energy cost of so doing is considerable.

Fortunately there are signs that the tide is changing, with many local repair facilities springing up. There are signs too that governments are addressing the problem. Earlier this year the European Parliament voted in favour of establishing strong 'right to repair' rules. Ministers here have committed to follow, with the aim of extending the lifespan of products by up to 10 years. Meanwhile it's great to know that electronics, along with all sorts of other

Downton Horticultural Society

It is the time of year when the garden at Exbury is probably at its finest. In the New Forest, bordering Beaulieu river and covering 200 acres, Exbury is renowned for spring colour due to its world-famous collection of rhododendrons and azaleas.

There are both evergreen and deciduous rhododendron varieties. Azaleas are a subgenus of rhododendron which are generally smaller and have funnel-shaped flowers. Beautiful as they are you are unlikely to see many rhododendrons growing in Downton as they need moist but well-drained, acid soil that is rich in organic matter, although they can be grown in pots if the soil in your garden is alkaline. However, it must be remembered that in times of drought tap water, especially in hard water areas such as ours, contains too much calcium for rhododendrons, reducing acidity around their roots and 'locking up' iron so that it is unavailable to the plant.

You may have heard that one introduced species, Rhododendron ponticum, has become invasive in both the UK and Ireland, spreading in woodland areas and replacing the natural understorey. Unfortunately it is difficult to eradicate, as its roots can make new shoots.

Redlynch Local History Society Stoney Cross and the 367th Fighter Group by Henry Cole

The USAAF 367th FG was based at Stoney Cross for only 3 months in 1944. They arrived as a novice untried unit in April and left for Ibsley in July before moving to Normandy after a short stay. The Group had moved from the Los Angeles area to New York, and thence by troop ship to Greenock, by train to Ashurst, and by lorry to Stoney Cross. During this period the Group, comprising three squadrons, was equipped with twin engine P38 Lightnings despite the pilots only having single engine experience. The transition caused a number of accidents before proficiency was attained. Unfortunately, one such accident killed their only ace Jim Peck, one of only 4 pilots with previous combat experience.

Stoney Cross was regarded as a good posting due to its new and plentiful huts and three proper runways, the main one being a mile long. Despite the need for training, they found time to host an exhibition baseball game at Lyndhurst and dances at their base. One of the main organisers was Supply Sergeant Stanley Dunham who became well known after the war as Barrack Obama's maternal grandfather. Another character was Supply Sergeant MeeMee who ran the base's general café/shop where visiting bigwigs lunched. Two pilots formed a music duo at The New Forest Inn at Emery Down and spent so much time there they bought an Austin 7 to travel back and forth: the car was left there when the Group moved and was never collected as one of the partners was killed in Europe.

The worst operation the Group undertook was the low level attack on highly defended Cherbourg where seven pilots were killed in action (KIA) and only 11 of the returning aircraft escaped battle damage out of around 75 deployed. This caused them to be taken off operations for some days whilst repairs were made. Over 20% of the pilots were lost during the stay at Stoney Cross; when the Group moved to Ibsley to free the long runway for medium bombers, they set up headquarters on Moyles Court. Some of the officers were billeted at Cuckoos Hill, Hayward Sumner's house. At the end of the European War they were about to sail for the final stages against Japan but fortunately the sudden end caused them to be rerouted to New York where the CO told them to go home with the correct assumption they would not be recalled.


Daily hope and encouragement
