

From Revd. Ron Hart, a retired priest in the Forest & Avon Team, who lives in Downton.

Dear Friends, Creddy and I hope you are keeping well.

One of the early lockdown instructions sent by the Bishop to clergy concerned the over 70's. We were not to be used, and we were told to stay in and self-shield. Like many others, we suddenly found life changing, and some of the things that gave shape and meaning to life were at least temporarily no longer possible. No taking services, no sharing in worship and in various meetings, no visiting. We had to let go.

This learning to let go is anyway one of the tasks of retirement, in the case of clergy as you move from 'captain' to a rower in a boat someone else is steering. It brings its own blessings, not least the chance to have time with family and with God. It is also a time to remember that our identity is founded not on what we do but on being a loved child of God. Paul, who had had an esteemed position in Jewish society, had to leave it behind when he became a Christian - yet he could say 'I count all things as loss for the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus as Lord'.

'I can't breathe' has become one of the memorable cries of recent months. I can't breathe because your knee is on my neck, and I am the victim of racial prejudice. I can't breathe because I have Covid and need help. I can't breathe because my grief chokes me. Maybe Jesus on the cross thought 'I can't breathe' because the consequence of crucifixion is death by asphyxiation. I can't breathe has become a metaphor for all that is wrong or sad. I can't breathe because of toxic fumes from the factory in India, I can't breathe says the fish, the water is polluted, I can't breathe because our society denies me the opportunities that it gives to others, says the BLM movement.

Breath is a sign of life. God breathed life into Adam, and the breath of God breathed life into the church. As breath came back for a while to the countryside and cities in lockdown, lost vistas returned, and wildlife has thrived. The spotlight has come in a new way on the problems of sickness, pollution, racism and inequality, and people have been saying "I can't breathe"

We ask, where is God leading us in all this? We have been forced to slow down, and in the process many have found a new love for God as they gave Him time. And we have been forced to see the ills around us in sharper light, and perhaps we are being challenged to work with renewed concern for a better and more just world. Like the Jews at the time of the Exodus, there has been a stopping to encounter the God who tabernacles with us, but also the awareness that the cloud of glory is calling us to a new place.

We will maintain proper physical distancing and hygiene procedures will be observed, especially during the administration of communion which will be wafers only. Our service in church is an opportunity for those who feel able and ready to attend, and no one should feel under pressure to do so. We will continue



to record services for each Sunday, which are available to watch through the church website.

Morning Worship is being said by the Vicar at 10.30am on Wednesdays in church. This is

not a public or recorded service, but he will ring the church bell at 10.30am as a call to worship and you are encouraged to join him in a time of prayer from your own homes. On the third Wednesday of the month he will incorporate our Roads to God prayers (see page 2).

Immediately following Morning Worship on Wednesdays, the Church will be open from 11:00am to 12:30pm for private prayer. This gives 72 hours between Wednesday and Sunday openings. A member of the Church will be present at all times as a steward, and everyone will be asked to maintain physical distancing and to leave their contact details.

#### Daily Hope phone line to continue beyond lockdown

A free phone line offering hymns, prayers, and reflections after church buildings closed because of the coronavirus is to continue despite moves to ease the lockdown restrictions



<u>Daily Hope</u>, launched by the Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, in April, is available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044. It was set up as a simple new way to bring worship and prayer into people's homes, especially older people and anyone unable to join online church services. Many people who are vulnerable due to their health or their age are understandably reluctant to return to their place of worship.

Callers to the line are welcomed with a short new greeting from the Archbishop before being able to choose from a range of options, including hymns, prayers, reflections and advice on COVID-19.



# **Update & Guidelines for Visiting Downton Surgery - September 2020 (Including Flu Clinics)**

Coronavirus is once again on the rise. It remains important that we all stay safe and continue to control the virus and we appreciate your help in doing this; we kindly ask that you only attend the surgery if invited to do so by a doctor or nurse, or to collect a prescription. Please continue to use telephone and online services whenever possible. If you are attending in person please adhere to the following guidelines:

- Please wear a mask or face covering for all appointments.
- Please respect the social distancing guidelines allow people plenty of space to pass by at a safe distance.
- Please sanitise your hands on the way in and out of the premises – dispensers are available throughout the building.
- We are double disinfecting / cleansing all surfaces between patients – personal items such as handbags and coats can carry all sorts of virus particles; please leave your belongings safely at home or in your car if at all possible rather than bringing them into clinical rooms.
- Please attend on your own if able, leaving other family members at home or in the car to wait; children should be left with an alternative carer if at all possible.

We will also be doing our part to protect the population in line with NHS guidelines and issuing up to 4000 flu immunisations, hopefully starting from 22<sup>nd</sup> September; we will be doing it by age group, please look out for website information / text and letters from us shortly. There will be online booking which we encourage you to use if at all possible and a dedicated phone number to try to keep lines free for patients who require more immediate assistance.

#### **Update & Guidelines for Visiting Downton Surgery (continued)**

Clinics will look a little different this year and we are grateful for the use of the Cuckoo Fair gazebos which will be making an appearance for the occasion in the grounds by the surgery. We would like to do our bit to protect the planet, and for those of you who do not already have several reusable wash and wear masks, you will soon see a mask tree outside the surgery. If anyone would like to make reusable masks for the surgery we will offer them to our patients for free or a voluntary donation, which will support various local community schemes, such as a carers' café; a gardening project; fitness initiatives; etc. This will avoid up to 4000 masks going to landfill, as you will be asked to wear one when attending for the flu clinic in the same way as you would for an appointment in the Surgery.

If anyone would like to offer assistance with marshalling for the flu clinics we would be happy to hear from you – preferably by email for attention of our Social Prescriber, Carol Baker.

#### The Memorial Centre is now open

The Trustees are pleased to announce that the Memorial Centre can now be used again for certain activities as long as government regulations are adhered to.




#### **Downton Christmas Festival**

The meeting of the Parish Council was held on Monday 10<sup>th</sup> August 2020 as a virtual meeting using Zoom. This was permitted under new legislation contained in the Local Authorities and Police and Crime Panels (Coronavirus) (Flexibility of Local Authority and Police and Crime Panel Meetings) (England and Wales) Regulations 2020. Five members of the public were present.

Wiltshire Council matters: Cllr Clewer gave the following report:

- More work was being done to clear the cycleway between Downton and Salisbury and this task would be added to a list for regular maintenance.
- The pedestrianisation of Salisbury's streets was proving to be 'interestingly contentious' and he suggested that the Council should follow its progress.
- On the matter of anti-social behaviour issues, he said he was satisfied that everything was being done which could be done by the relevant departments at Wiltshire Council which were dealing with the issues.

**Amenities Committee:** Cllr Brentor gave a brief report on a recent meeting at which:

- It was agreed that the planters for Downton In Bloom should be ordered and installed with winter bulbs.
- The potential cost of replacing street name signs was considered and the numbers required with the view that funding would not be sought from the Community Area Transport Group.
- Work to maintain the overgrown boundary of the Moot Lane Recreation Ground was agreed.

#### Ride and Stride for Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust

St Laurence Church will again participate in the annual 'Ride and Stride' on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> September in aid of the <u>Wiltshire Historic Churches Trust</u>. It will take a very different form this year as St Laurence Church will be unable to provide hospitality and toilet facilities for walkers and riders visiting the church.

Our Treasurer, Mark Merrill, will again walk between a number of churches around Salisbury and hopes that many will sponsor him to do so. Because of the social distancing rules he will travel alone, but he encourages others to make their own journeys between churches either on foot or by bicycle. #### The Downton Moot Needs YOU

For many people in the village the outside space of the Moot has been a perfect place to visit for exercise and recreation during lockdown, either with their dog, family or both. It is easy to underestimate the merits of this historical public garden, open 365 days of the year, and free to everyone – other villages and towns are not so lucky.

Wandering round recently we admired the fruits of the hard labour of volunteers; the borders and the pond looked truly magnificent. However in spite of the volunteers' work, the Moot desperately needs funds to cover the unavoidable fixed costs.

It may not be common knowledge but the maintenance and safety of the Moot requires a minimum of £10,000 per annum to keep the gardens open to all. This has been just about achievable through fundraising events and donations. The former, due to Covid-19, have been impossible and this could be the case for the coming months. In June we had thought the annual Dog Show might be a possibility in September, however it would not be the right thing to do under the current circumstances. Donations have been on the decline over recent years as donors have moved on or passed away, and generally regular donations have not been forthcoming.

We want the future generations of Downton to be able to enjoy this historic outdoor village asset, which has benefited us all, whatever age, whether for a picnic, a walk or a bit of sledging in the snow!



#### **Downton Horticultural Society**

We have been asked to provide some information about taking and propagating Fuchsia cuttings. They are one of the easiest of all plants to take cuttings from and will root very easily under the correct conditions. Cuttings can be taken as softwood cuttings in spring, or semi-hardwood cuttings in summer or early autumn. Cuttings taken in spring will root in two to three weeks and flower by the summer. Cuttings taken in summer or autumn will need protection over winter.

To take Fuchsia cuttings you will need a sharp knife or secateurs, a clean pot or seed tray of free draining compost (made with one part sharp sand or grit and two parts potting compost), a dibber and a small planting widger or fork. The general method is as follows:

- Choose a healthy donor plant with fresh shoots at least 8 cm (3 in) long and take an 8 cm cutting just below a leaf joint of a non-flowering shoot.
- Place on a flat surface and cut away the lower leaves with a sharp knife.
- 3. Dust the base of the cutting in hormone rooting powder or gel/liquid.
- 4. Pot them in a free draining gritty compost mix, inserting them about 3-6 cm (1-2 in) apart so the leaves are not touching.
- 5. Water well and place the cuttings in a propagator or cover with clear plastic to retain high humidity.
- 6. Place in a well-lit position but not in direct sunlight at a temperature above 18°C (65°F) and keep moist.
- 7. After 2/3 weeks once roots start to form, open the propagator vents and gradually remove the lid until the plants become acclimatised.
- 8. Once a good root system has developed prick out the new plantlets into individual small pots of general potting compost, and use liquid tomato feed to encourage flowering shoots.
- 9. Harden off and plant out once all danger of frost has passed in May.
- 10. Once the plants have grown three or four leaf joints, pinch out the tips to encourage bushy growth.

I hope you are successful if you try this, and I would like to acknowledge the <u>Seasonal Gardening</u> website.

#### **Courgette soup**

Based on a Delia Smith recipe, this was sent to the editor when all gardeners seemed to have too many courgettes ...

Sauté 1 chopped onion, and garlic if wished. (If you sauté in butter it comes out creamier.)

Add 1lb courgettes and 4 oz of potatoes, both diced. Cook gently. When really soft, add 1.5 pints stock, season to taste if needed, and cook

for another 10 minutes or so, then liquidise.

#### **RAF Stoney Cross. Part 1**

Stoney Cross was originally planned to be a secret airfield devoid of the usual facilities and heavily camouflaged aircraft dispersal areas. Chattis Hill and Marwell Hall (now Marwell Zoo) were actually completed in this concept and were mainly used for aircraft assembly, the large sheds being hidden by trees. However in the case of Stoney Cross it was decided to make it an advanced airbase and emergency airfield due to its nearness to occupied France.


Work commenced in 1942 and was still being finished off in 1944. Despite this, aircraft arrived in January 1943 and the airfield was operated by Army Co-operation Command RAF. Squadrons at various times in early 1943 were 239, 26 and 175, all operating the early Allison engined Mustang. This was a very fast, long ranging aircraft at low level and ideal for the reconnaissance and strafing role. Whilst operations were undertaken over France much time was spent working on exercises with the Army to prepare for D-Day.

In April 1943 Wimpey, the contractors, were still finishing runways, taxi ways and dispersals when a Mustang crashed into a works lorry killing three civilians. This led to the aircraft leaving until work was completed. In the interim USAAF B17's appeared dropping off operationally exhausted USAAF air crew for Rest and Recuperation at Broadlands.

When completed the airfield had four T2 Hangars plus extensive support and accommodation. Accommodation was to the south and east sides of the airfield. The airfield was, and still is, very visible from the air and is quite distinctive with its unusual layout of three runways and their tightly wrapped taxi ways (perimeter track). This was necessary due to its location on a ridge with the ground falling away to the north, east and south. The current road to Lynwood is on the main east / west runway whilst the road from Nomansland toward Minstead is the eastern part of the perimeter track.

In August 1943 the airfield was judged ready for regular flying and 297 Squadron RAF arrived on 1st September with Whitley and Albemarle parachute-dropping aircraft which delivered commandos raiding St Valery that month. In November the squadron split into three, to form two additional squadrons, 299 Squadron at Stoney Cross and 298 at Tarrant Rushton.

In the autumn of 1943 US personnel arrived to start the assembly of Hadrian gliders as part of the invasion preparations. The rapid pace of change did not slacken as 299 re-equipped with Stirling IV aircraft for the paratrooper role and 297 undertook supply drops to occupied France. Paratrooper exercises continued night and day until mid-March when both moved to the Oxfordshire / N. Wiltshire area to free up Stoney Cross for USAAF use prior to D-Day.


